10. Most of the population of the squatters belonged to Bangladesh and settled in Seemapuri. And people like Saheb-e-Aalam were refugees who had fled their country and migrated to Delhi from Dhaka in 1971. Their dwellings were structures of mud, tin, and tarpaulin with no sewage, drainage or running water. Picking garbage and rags helped them to earn their daily bread, gave them a roof over their heads, and was their only means of livelihood and survival. Though these squatters of Seemapuri have no identity but they do have valid ration cards that enable them to buy grain. Living in Seemapuri, which is on the periphery of Delhi, is like living in hell.
Children here grow up to become partners in survival to their parents. An army of barefoot children appears every morning, carrying their

plastic bags on their shoulders and disappear by noon. They are forced to live a life of abject poverty that results in the loss of childhood innocence. Saheb, a ragpicker, roamed in the streets, scrounging for garbage, barefoot and deprived of education. Later, he started working on a tea stall where he was given 800 rupees and all his meals but he lost his freedom and now he is no longer his own master.

OR

Though interviews are the main sources for communicating with celebrities. But some celebrities see themselves as victims and despise the interview as an unwarranted intrusion into their lives. Some of them feel it is immoral and unethical, just as in some primitive cultures it is believed that 'if one takes a photographic portrait of somebody then one is stealing that person's soul'. V.S. Naipaul feels that 'some people are wounded by interviews and lose a part of themselves. Lewis Carroll says that he has 'just a horror for the interviewer' and he never consented to be interviewed. Rudyard Kipling expressed an even more condemnatory attitude towards the interviewer. His wife reports her husband as saying that he considered an interview as a crime and immoral and thus it merits punishment. Thus, some of the perceptions are like the comments of the celebs.

Context - Here the poet celebrates the soothing beauty of nature in the wilderness; Pristine and colorful in its glory.

Explanation - Here in these lines, the poet describes the beautiful things which are present on earth such as the sun, moon, trees, flowers (daffodils), and rivers. The poet says that all these things are like a blessing bestowed on all the creatures by the earth. He further describes that the trees provide us with their shade, flowers with their beauty, and rivers with their coolness during the hot summers. Then there is a thick mass of ferns in the middle of the forest that bears sweet-smelling musk-roses. All of these are the beauties of nature which are like a boon for us.

OR

- (ii) **Reference** - These well-known eye-catching lines have been adopted from the poem - "Aunt Jennifer's Tiger", written by a very prominent Poetess - "Adrienne Rich" is an American poetess of the twentieth century.

Context - The poetess is giving a living description of the tigers embroidered by Aunt Jennifer in her panel.

Explanation - The tigers embroidered on a piece of cloth or a curtain by Aunt Jennifer, are described by the poetess. These tigers can be seen moving proudly across the curtain in an arrogant and jumping way. Their movement shows the freedom and the power enjoyed by them. They are bright yellows like topaz in complexion and live in their natural home, a green forest. They are fearless and are not afraid of the men sitting or standing under a tree. They move about in an elegant, grace, and self-confident manner.

- 13. People of the world speak in different languages. They indulge in unnecessary debates and disputes. Most of these arguments lead to destructive wars. The poet urges people to stop speaking in any language. They must speak through their

hearts. So far men have moved their arms only to harm others. Therefore, the poet wants that they should not move their arms so much. Let these arms rest for once. Let a feeling of mutual understanding, be created among human beings.

OR

In this poem, the poet wants the authorities – Governor, inspector, and visitors to realize their duties towards the children of the slum schools. He wants to draw their attention towards these helpless children's plight and do something for their betterment, which is an utmost need. Let these kids' study and learn to express themselves freely by visiting beautiful places which are granted by the nature with its beauty. Consequently, this way of grabbing knowledge will install a hunger in them to study to make their future better.

(ii) The poet hints at two worlds: the world of poverty, misery, and malnutrition of the slums where children are underfed, weak, and have stunted growth. The pictures on the wall suggesting happiness, richness, well-being, and beauty are in stark contrast to the dim and dull slums.

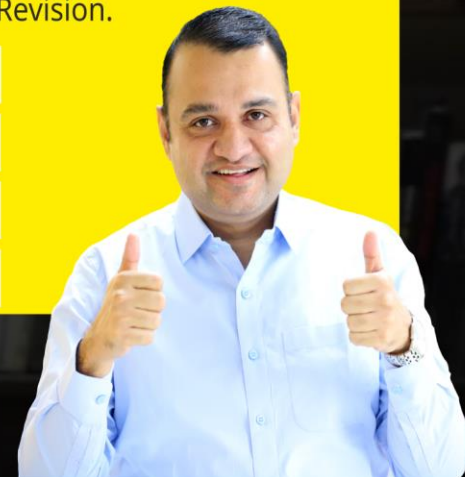
