Nation observes Janta curfew in fight against Covid-19



- The **Janta Curfew** was observed on 22nd march following Prime Minister Narendra Modi's appeal for people to voluntarily stay indoors to check the spread of Corona virus. In his address to the nation on the 19th of this month, Mr Modi appealed for a janta curfew from 7a.m. till 9 p.m.
- The Prime Minister stated Janta Curfew may have ended at 9 PM but that does not mean we should start celebrating and also do not consider it a success
- The Prime Minister also appealed to the countrymen to follow the instructions being issued by the central government and the state governments. He also suggested to the people not to leave the houses at all in Districts and states where the lockdown is announced. He stated, apart from this, people should also not get out of the houses unless it is very necessary

Cabinet approves Production Incentive Scheme for Large Scale Electronics Manufacturing



- Union Cabinet has approved financial assistance to the Modified Electronics Manufacturing Clusters Scheme
 for development of world class infrastructure along with common facilities and amenities through Electronics
 Manufacturing Clusters.
- Union Minister Ravi Shankar Prasadstated that the government also approved Production Incentive Scheme for Large Scale Electronics Manufacturing.
- The scheme proposes production linked incentive to boost domestic manufacturing and attract large investments in mobile phone manufacturing and specified electronic components.
- The Minister stated, the government will emphasize on mobile and component manufacturing in India. He stated that the Centre will invest Rs 20 lakh crore in this sector which will provide employment to 25 lakh people in next five years.
- The Cabinet also gave its nod to scheme on Promotion of Bulk Drug Parks for financing Common Infrastructure Facilities in three Bulk Drug Parks with financial implication of **Rs 3,000 crore** for **next five years.**
- Bulk Drug Park Scheme is expected to reduce manufacturing cost of bulk drugs in the country and dependency on other countries for bulk drugs.
- Production Linked Incentive Scheme for promotion of domestic manufacturing of critical Key Starting Material/Drug Intermediates and Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients, (APIs) in the country with financial implications of Rs 6,940 crore for next eight years also got approval.

- The Cabinet has approved inclusion of the AYUSH Health and Wellness Centres component of Ayushman Bharat in National AYUSH Mission. The move will reduce the burden on secondary and tertiary health care facilities.
- Union Cabinet also approved signing and ratifying of the Extradition Treaty between India and Belgium. Offences relating to taxation, or revenue or offfences of fiscal character also fall within the scope of the treaty.
- The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs has approved expenditure for reimbursing the losses under Minimum Support Price operations for cotton during the cotton years 2014-15 to 2018-19.

- The SAARC Disaster Management Centre has launched a website for information related to the COVID-19
 pandemic in the region. The website shows the number of coronavirus cases in the member states while updating the
 numbers regularly. SAARC Disaster Management Centre launches website for information related to COVID-19

- Earlier, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had proposed it during the recent video conference with leaders and representatives of the member states. The website shows that at least 960 coronavirus cases have been reported in the SAARC region. It says that at least five people have lost their lives in India, three in Pakistan, while two died in Bangladesh due to COVID-19

- Foreign Minister of Bangladesh Dr. AK Abdul Momen stated that Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina approved the fund for SAARC secretariat to face the outbreak of Corona virus in South Asia,
- Welcoming the creation of the fund Dr. Momen stated that there are various funds under SAARC protocol but so far
 there was no such protocol for preventing health hazards. He stated Bangladesh would like the SAARC secretariat to
 administer the fund towards fighting COVID-19 pandemic in the regions
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced on 8th March that India will contribute dollar 10 million to the
 fund. Other countries of SAARC like Nepal and Afghanistan have pledged 1 million dollar each while Maldives
 will contribute 2 lakh dollars and Bhutan 1 lakh dollar to the emergency fund

Online Tawajudi service introduced to help residents overseas re-enter UAE



- In **United Arab Emirates**, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation introduced a new service on its website: "**Tawajudi for residents**".
- The new service is intended for residents with valid residencies and who are outside the country. This service aims to facilitate their safe return to the UAE in emergency situations.
- Residents who are currently abroad can register for this service through the website, thus facilitating communication
 with them in case of emergency.
- Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation stated that UAE is keen to ensure the health and safety of
 residents on its land and facilitate their return to the country in emergency cases.
- UAE had earlier announced that it had suspended the entry of all its valid residence visa holders, who are currently
 out of the country, for a renewable period of two weeks effective from 19th March, due to the spread of COVID-19.
 Expatriates of 180 nationalities including Indians are staying in the UAE

SBI opens emergency credit line to meet any liquidity mismatch for its borrowers



- Amid businesses getting affected due to the novel coronavirus pandemic, the country's largest lender State Bank of
 India has opened an emergency credit line to meet any liquidity mismatch for its borrowers.
- The additional liquidity facility **Covid-19 Emergency Credit Line (CECL)**, will provide funds up to **200 crore** rupees and will be available till June 30, SBI stated in a circular.
- The loan will be offered at an interest rate of 7.25 per cent with a tenure of 12 months. Borrowers can avail
 maximum 10 per cent of the existing fund based working capital limits, subject to a cap of 200 crore rupees

Insurance, health tech companies announce policies to cover COVID-19



- With the number of coronavirus (Covid-19) patients in India rising exponentially, several health, insurance and banking institutions are offering special policies that provide free medical cover to those who have been tested positive.
- While the sector regulator Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has
 mandated the insurance companies to cover hospitalisation and quarantine for the Covid-19 patients, a majority of
 these policies entail that the diseases declared as pandemic by the World Health Organisation would be excluded,
 which leaves the customers in the lurch.
- Under the IRDAI's sandbox initiative, many companies have either redesigned their health policies or introduced separate Covid-19 cover packages. **Bajaj Allianz Life**, for instance, introduced a first-of-its-kind **Artificial**

Intelligence-enabled chatbot and live chat-integrated WhatsApp service for its customers who want to buy or stay updated about the policies from the service provider.

- ICICI Lombard, a non-life insurance company, announced a special package for its customers who test positive for Covid-19 at any government health facility. The company will pay 100 per cent of the sum insured irrespective of the hospitalisation expenses. The health cover is priced at a premium of RS 149 and provides a sum insured of Rs 25,000, including services such as health assistance, chat or virtual assistance, tele-consultation and ambulance assistance, as part of the offerings.
- **Clinikk Healthcare**, a health tech firm, stated that it is offering a Covid-19 protection cover of up to Rs 1 lakh, including free online medical consultations to all those who buy its package of Rs 499.
- The company stated that it will also tie up with various corporate and businesses for special employee packages that cover Covid-19 cases. **Start Health Insurance**, a standalone health insurer, also announced its coronavirus policy available under two sum insured options: Rs 21,000 at premium of Rs459 plus GST and Rs 42,000 at premium of '918 plus GST.

- **Google** has launched its dedicated search portal with **Covid-19** related information including safety tips, important information and relevant contacts in India.
- The search giant displays a snippet of the page with consolidated information right at the top of the search results when users search for 'coronavirus' or 'Covid-19' on both, desktop as well as mobile devices.
- The portal was which was launched in the US on March 21 has now been extended to India. The information
 displayed in the section is divided into four tabs-overview, symptoms, prevention and treatments.

- Depending on the location, users can see the link of the national government portal in the overview section. In India, the section displays a link to the official website of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. The website has detail information regarding the current status of the outbreak in the country along with the preventive measures taken by the government and relevant advisories to curb the spread of the outbreak.
- The symptoms, prevention and treatment sections have detailed information regarding the same provided by the World Health Organization.
- Google will be adding more information over time to its portal. It will soon include a carousel of Twitter accounts
 from local civic organisations and health authorities. It will also be adding detailed modules with statistics and a map
 that can help the status of Covid-19 prevalence in countries around the world according to its official blog post.

S&P estimates cost of Covid-19 for Asia-Pacific, including India, at \$620 billion



- With the Covid-19 pandemic spreading rapidly, S&P Global Ratings updated its estimate of economic loss to \$620
 billion for the Asia-Pacific region, which includes India. It has already lowered growth projection for India and other countries.
- The total and permanent income loss for Asia-Pacific of approximately \$620 billion will be distributed across sovereign, bank, corporate, and household balance sheets. In rupee terms, it comes to around ₹ 46,500 crore (\$1 = ₹75). The agency lists 14 countries in its report for Asia-Pacific region, which includes mainly China, Japan, Australia and India
- In its latest report, the agency lowered estimate for next fiscal (2020-21, starting from April 1) from its December forecast of 6.5 per cent to 5.2 per cent. Similarly, for fiscal year 2021-22, projection for growth rate was revised by 10 basis point to 6.9 per cent. However, for the next two years (2022-23 and 2023-24), estimates remained at 7 per cent for both fiscals.

- With lockdown declared in over 80 districts (out of 700 plus) and manufacturing activities halted in many sectors, including automobile, the Indian Government is yet to come out with any preliminary estimate of loss. Though the Prime Minister announced setting up a Covid-19 Economic Response Task Force under the Finance Minister, there is no formal communication on its constitution.
- The Prime Minister had stated in his address that this global pandemic was going to have a wide-ranging impact on the economy. Accordingly, the Task Force will take decisions in the near future, based on regular interactions and feedback from all stakeholders, and analysis of all situations and dimensions. This Task Force will also ensure that all steps taken to reduce the economic difficulties are effectively implemented

NBFCs seek moratorium on EMIs for at least 3 months



- The Finance Industry Development Council (FIDC) has requested the Reserve Bank of India and the
 Government to announce a moratorium on EMI (equated monthly instalment) payment for at least a three
 months; allow restructuring of accounts that may become delinquent; and extend the period for recognition of nonperforming assets (NPAs) from the current three months to six months past the due date.
- FIDC, which is the representative body of assets and loan financing NBFCs, reasoned that the Covid-19 pandemic is
 expected to have a significant and perhaps a long-term impact on the Indian economy, especially the MSME, auto,
 transportation and trading segments.
- Non-banking finance companies (NBFCs) are at the forefront of financing many of the affected sectors, notably small
 road transport operators, taxi aggregators, infrastructure contractors, MSMEs, traders, etc., and the current situation
 is likely to result in delayed payment of EMIs even by customers with a hitherto excellent and unblemished
 repayment history, FIDC stated.

About NBFCs:

- Non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) are financial institutions that offer various banking services but do not
 have a banking license. Generally, these institutions are not allowed to take traditional demand deposits—readily
 available funds, such as those in checking or savings accounts—from the public. This limitation keeps them outside
 the scope of conventional oversight from federal and state financial regulators.
- NBFCs can offer banking services such as loans and credit facilities, currency exchange, retirement planning, money
 markets, underwriting, and merger activities.

UP govt announces one month free food grains to poor; Rs 1,000 as compensation to daily wagers



- Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has announced to provide one month free food grains to poor people along with Rs 1,000 as compensation to daily wage workers who have been affected due to the outbreak of deadly virus.
- More than 20 lakh 37 thousand labourers registered with labour department will be given rupees 1000 each in their accounts through DBT scheme.
- One crore 65 lakh needy poor people will be provided one month food stuff including 20 kilograms flour free of cost.
- People under old age pension, Divyang pension and widows and poor people pension will be given two
 months advance.
- Owners of schools, Malls, restaurants and hotels and other institutions have been asked to provide appropriate payments to the effected labourers.
- The government has decided that the rest of the poor people and daily wagers will be given help on the recommendation of concerned area officials.

- North Korea fired two projectiles that appeared to be short-range ballistic missiles into the sea off the east coast of the Korean peninsula.
- The suspected missiles were fired from **North Pyongan province**. The province is above Pyongyang on the northwest corner of the Korean peninsula bordering China.
- Earlier this month, North Korea test-fired a new type of missile which is thought could also be launched from a submarine.
- The projectiles landed outside Japan's maritime exclusive economic zone.
- The South Korean military would maintain its readiness to track and monitor further launches.

Researchers in United States discover communication network in plants



- Researchers in the United States have discovered a communication network in plants that helps them respond to a hormone involved in pest resistance. This may help develop crops that can withstand insect attacks.
- The study, published in the journal 'Nature Plants', observed that the hormone called jasmonic acid is particularly important for a plant's defense response against fungi and insects.
- In the study, the scientists used the plant **Arabidopsis thaliana**, a widely studied small flowering plant in the mustard family, whose genome has been well characterised.

Scientists discover prehistoric wonder chicken

- The **oldest fossil of a modern bird** yet found, dating from the **age of dinosaurs**, has been identified by an **international team of palaeontologists.**
- The spectacular fossil, affectionately nicknamed the 'Wonderchicken', includes a nearly complete skull, hidden inside nondescript pieces of rock, and dates from less than one million years before the asteroid impact which eliminated all large dinosaurs.
- Detailed analysis of the skull shows that it combines many features common to modern chicken- and duck-like birds, suggesting that the 'Wonderchicken' is close to the last common ancestor of modern chickens and ducks. The fossil was found in a limestone quarry near the **Belgian-Dutch border**, making it the first modern bird from the age of dinosaurs found in the northern hemisphere.
- The skull, despite its age, is clearly recognisable as a modern bird. It combines many features common to the group that includes living chickens and ducks a group called *Galloanserae*. Field describes the skull as a kind of 'mash-up' of a chicken and a duck.
