Nothing is instantaneous. For every endeavor-whether in the area of career, academics, music, sports, relationships, physical fitness, or even in spirituality-it is a long arduous journey. Only if we are willing to put in the time, and painstaking effort and have faith, can we get results. If we don't accept this difficult-but-

true fact of life, our lives will be far from being happy and fulfilling. For we may not make that extra effort that can change the course of life dramatically, for the good. The major problems with these 'instant coffee' solutions are that they are invariably short-lived. If we stubbornly refuse to give up this search for quick solutions, all we do is end up on the wrong track.

10. According to Umberto Eco, the success of the book - "The Name of the Rose" was nothing but a mystery. On another hand, the American publisher believed that people like trash whereas 'The Name of the Rose' delved into metaphysics, theology, and medieval history and people do not like such difficult reading experiences. Through his novel, which was sold between 10 to 15 million copies, Umberto Eco reached only a small percentage of readers.
Eco says these are those readers who do not want to have an easy reading experience. He feels this detective story that delved into metaphysics, theology and medieval history interested the readers as it was written at the most appropriate time. Had it been written a decade earlier or later, it would not have been so successful. Even though it contained somewhat heavy reading, the book attracted a

mass audience and Eco became famous as a novelist, rather than an academic scholar the world over.

OR

It has no doubt that bangle-making in the furnaces of Firozabad is just next to risk and danger. The author expresses her concern over their exploitation in the hazardous job of bangle-making. The working conditions of all bangle-makers are pathetic and miserable. They work in high-temperature, badly lit, and poorly ventilated glass furnaces due to which child workers especially are at risk of losing their eyesight at an early age and get prone to other health hazards. The stinking lanes of Firozabad are choked with garbage and humans and animals live together in these hovels. There is no development or progress in their lives with the passage of time. They have no choice but to work in these inhuman conditions. Mind-numbing toil kills their dreams and hopes. They are condemned to live and die in squalor, subjected to a life of poverty and perpetual exploitation.

12. **Reference** - These well-known eye-catching lines have been adopted from the poem - "Keeping Quiet", written by a very prominent Poet - "Pablo Neruda".

Context - Insisting upon the need for keeping quiet for a moment and doing nothing, the poet exhorts us to learn from the earth which seems dead in autumn but becomes full of life in spring.

Explanation - In these lines, the poet suggests to human beings that we should learn a lesson from Earth. During the winters everything freezes and becomes lifeless. But when the season changes and it's the onset of the spring season, everything presents in nature such as the trees, birds, rivers, etc. gets life. So here, the poet, by giving the example of nature, wants to say that all human beings should stop and try to judge their deeds. They can try and make their life better with calmness, peace. Finally, he ends up by saying that now he will count up to twelve so that we all may become quiet. Here 'quiet' means to calm down ourselves and move towards the path of peace and harmony. After saying this he says 'I will go'. He says so as he has conveyed his message to the people and wants them to be left alone to think about it and work in the direction of peace.

OR

Reference - These well-known eye-catching lines have been adopted from the poem - "A Thing of Beauty", written by a very prominent Poet - "John Keats".

Context - In these lines, the poet praises beautiful things for the profound and joyous effect that they provide us.

Explanation - The poet says that a thing of beauty is permanent which stays forever. It never fades away. Rather, it increases with the passing time. It is a source of endless joy for us. It provides us with a shelter full of quietude, asleep with sweet dreams, and healthy with soft breathing. For the poet, beauty is like a beautiful shady tree under whose shade all the creatures can sleep peacefully and enjoy good health.

13. The poem Keeping Quiet written by Pablo Neruda is about peace, fraternity and prosperity. He claims that to sustain peace and harmony, we must take time to pause and reflect. Many of our social, political, and religious problems can be solved in a very easy way, according to the poet. Self-introspection is the answer. The poet too has experienced the repercussions of war and his

appeal for peace shows that he is fed up seeing humans killing each other for power and money.

The various pictures that are posted on the walls are holding a contradictory world of these slum-dwelling children, As they live in poverty-stricken as well as pathetic living conditions - without adequate facilities and education. Their surroundings hamper their physical and mental growth. They see crimes happening around them, all the time, which is why it is said in the poem that for these children Shakespeare is a wicked man. these pictures on the wall suggest prosperity, progress beauty - a world of brightness and love. But the world of the slum children is ugly and lacks prosperity.

Its ice folds hold over half-million-year-old carbon records that are so crucial for the study of the Earth's past, present, and future, thus trapping the world's geological history in Antarctica.

Both girls were mistreated in their childhood in a certain aspect. Zitkala Sa was ill-treated by the European school administration as she belonged to America. As shown in the story her moccasins were taken away, and they remove her blanket from her shoulders which make her feel so insulted and her hair was shingled. In Zitkala's culture, only a coward's hair was cut down and girls did not wear tight-fitting clothes as they were considered immodest. She was even pointed out for not following the table manners. All this took away her confidence and she was left in tears. But when she grew up, she with the power of her education wrote articles against the Carlisle Indian School and their discrimination against the Native Americans.

On the suggestion of her brother, Bama studied hard and became a famous writer, and wrote against caste discrimination. 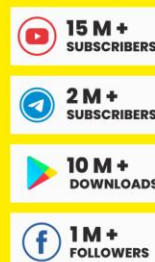
